- two additional questions for each word or form of a word
- passages and related Test questions for Cumulative/Midterm/Final Tests

\*You may choose questions for the Tests you create either by word or by lesson number

#### How to Use the Lesson Tests

With the Test Generator, you have the ability to test as many words as you wish, in any order or combination that you wish.

- You can test after one lesson or after a group of lessons.
- You can test as many or as few words as you wish from each lesson or group of lessons.
- You can pretest words to help you plan your teaching, directly teach words with which students struggle, then use the same words to create a Posttest.
- You can create alternate forms of Tests for security purposes.

To create a new Test for a single lesson:

- ① After you log in, click on **Custom Tests**.
- ② Click on **Create New Test**. Follow the on-screen directions.
- ③ **Edit Custom Test** will appear. Click **Add Questions**.
- ④ Check off the Book and Lesson you wish to test. (Figure 1)

- ⑤ Decide whether you wish to choose the words yourself or have the generator choose a given number of words for you at random. Check off **Select by Word**, **Select Number from Each Lesson**, or **Select Total Number**. In this example, we have chosen **Select by Word**. (Figure 2)
- ⑥ Click on **Continue »**.

- ⑦ Check the words you wish to test, then click **Show Questions**. (Figure 3)
- ⑧ You will now see a list of the questions available for each word you selected. Check off the questions you wish to use. (Figure 4)

- ⑨ Click **Add Questions**, and your new Test will appear.
- ⑩ Click **View and Print**. You can print your Test or Answer Key.

To create a new Test covering more than one lesson:

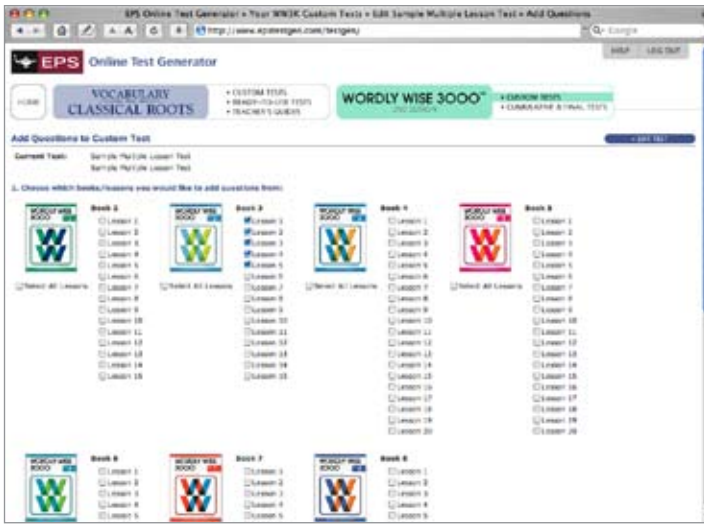

- ① After you log in, click on **Custom Tests**.
- ② Click on **Create New Test**. Follow the on-screen directions.
- ③ **Edit Custom Test** will appear. Click **Add Questions**.
- ④ Check off the Book and Lessons you wish to test. In this example, we wish to create a Test that covers the first 5 lessons in *Wordly Wise 3000*, Book 3. (Figure 5)

- ⑤ Decide whether you wish to choose the words yourself or have the generator choose a given number of words for you at random. Check off **Select by Word**, **Select Number from Each Lesson**, or **Select Total Number**. In this example, we have chosen **Select Number from Each Lesson**. (Figure 6)
- ⑥ Click on **Continue »**.

- ⑦ Enter the number of questions you want from each lesson. (Figure 7)
- ⑧ Click **Add Questions** and your new Test will appear.

- ⑨ Click **View and Print**. You can print your Test or Answer Key. (Figure 8)

**NOTE:** For the sake of security, you may create different Tests for different students—using the same words. Click on the word and choose a different test item for each separate Test you wish to create, or click **Randomize Order** to present the same questions in a different order.

### How to use the Cumulative/Midterm/Final Tests

These Tests assess the ability of students to apply a selection of the words from previous lessons in new contexts. Each Test begins with a passage containing words from previous lessons, followed by a set of multiple-choice questions designed to test those words. All the passages in these Tests contain content entirely different from the passages found in *Wordly Wise 3000* 2nd Edition Student Book. Several of these passages/Tests can be found in print form in the *Wordly Wise 3000* 2nd Edition *Teacher's Resource Book*.

These Tests are provided in three different groupings, depending on level:

#### Book 2 Cumulative/Final Tests

At this level, students need more frequent reinforcement and assessment.

A set of three Cumulative Tests (labeled Cumulative Test 1, 2, and 3) is provided after each set of four lessons. Note that the first set, following Lesson 4, tests words from Lessons 1–4; the second set, following Lesson 8, tests words from Lessons 1–8, and so on.

You may choose one, two, or all three of the Cumulative

Tests to assess your students' learning. (Each one tests 10 words in the context of a new passage.)

You may provide alternative Tests (1, 2, or 3) to students.

We recommend that you choose two out of three of the Final Tests to provide a wider and deeper picture of your students' progress.

#### Book 3 Cumulative/Final Tests

At this level, a set of three Cumulative Tests (labeled Cumulative Test 1, 2, and 3) is provided after each set of five lessons. Note that the first set, following Lesson 5, tests words from Lessons 1–5; the second set, following Lesson 10, tests words from Lessons 1–10, and so on.

You may choose one, two, or all three of the Cumulative Tests to assess your students' learning. (Each one tests 10 words in the context of a new passage.)

You may provide alternative Tests (1, 2, or 3) to students.

We recommend that you choose two out of three of the Final Tests to provide a wider and deeper picture of your students' progress.

#### Books 4-12 Midterm/Final Tests

At these levels, a set of three Midterm Tests (labeled Midterm Test 1, 2, and 3) is provided after Lesson 10. This Test covers Lessons 1 through 10.

You may choose one, two, or all three of the Midterm Tests to assess your students' learning. (Each one tests 10 words in the context of a new passage.)

You may provide alternative Tests (1, 2, or 3) to students.

There are 6 Final Tests, covering Lessons 1 through 20, provided at these levels; however, some of the Test passages are paired, labeled "Part 1" and "Part 2." We recommend that you choose 2 sets of passages to provide a wider and deeper picture of your students' progress.

### To Create a Cumulative (Books 2 & 3) or Midterm and Final Test (Books 4-12)

---

- ① After you log in, click on **Cumulative & Final Tests**.
- ② Click on the span of lessons you wish to cover.
- ③ Decide how many passages you will use to test the words.
- ④ Click on the Test you've selected and its Answer Key.
- ⑤ Print the Test.

Note that each Cumulative/Midterm/Final Test tests 10 words in the context of a new passage.

#### Cumulative (Books 2 & 3)/Midterm Tests

You may use 1, 2, or 3 passages and the questions that follow them. We recommend that you use at least 2 Tests to achieve wider coverage of the words.

#### Final Tests

There are 6 Final Tests, covering Lessons 1–20. Some of these Test passages are paired, labeled Part 1 and Part 2. We recommend that you choose two sets/pairs of passages as you create your Final Test.

### Pretests and Posttests

---

You may wish to pretest your students at the beginning of each lesson to determine whether they already know some of the words.

- ① After you log in, follow the procedures listed on [page 2](#) of this document to create your Test.
- ② Administer the Test.
  - Note the words that seem to provide the most problem for your students. For example, if 60% of your students did NOT understand the meaning of a particular word or words, you may want to focus primarily on those words in your classroom instruction and practice.
  - You can also direct individual students to focus on the words they did not know, providing additional practice.
  - Some students may already know all or most of the words presented. If this is the case, proceed with the lesson, perhaps at a faster rate, as more practice aids retention and deepening of understanding.

When you and your students have completed the lesson, create a Posttest using the same procedure as for the Pretest.

- Choose each word from the lesson and a different corresponding item than you used on the Pretest.
- OR
- Choose only those words for which students have NOT shown mastery.

If, after the Posttest, students have not demonstrated mastery, you may wish to provide extra practice using the *Teacher's Resource Book* Lesson Review Exercises.
